
Data published in this report were extracted from a live database; thus, it is possible that figures reported in tables and charts do not balance to totals reported in other reports published by the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC). Select distributions consist of estimates and are susceptible to rounding error and missing data that could have caused these distributions not to add up to exactly 100%. Current fiscal year data for the NDOC or for other agencies are not always available at time of edition; consequently, the NDOC performed its best effort to align data accordingly to derived estimates.

Unless specified, figures in this report are retrieved from the Nevada Department of Corrections InfoView data warehouse and from the Nevada Department of Corrections Offender Tracking System (NOTIS).

^b The NDOC must be able to identify offenders that fall in various age categories to determine the applicability of laws and regulations that are specific to the individual's actual age. Thus, Beginning with Fiscal Year 2016, age groups no longer encompass ages that are rounded down or up. The change in methodology may have caused a small shift in the frequencies that fall in each group relative to former editions of this report.




Percent of Population and Length Employed or in Training Before Incarceration







Percent of Inmates that Lived in Foster Care Female Male




Distribution of Offenders by Ethnicity and Correctional Location In-House Population






Recidivism by County of Commitment


Female Population Projection Comparison State Fiscal Year 2021










Monthly Fluctuation in Prison Moves






Summary of Macroeconomic and Employment Indicators

- Unemployment continued to improve by declining from a seasonally adjusted rate of 8.1% at the end of the first quarter to 7.8% by the end of the second quarter of Calendar Year 2021. The seasonally adjusted rate was still 4.1 percentage points above the pre-pandemic rate of 3.7%.
- Despite the recessionary impact of the pandemic, per-capita income in Nevada increased \$7,760 dollars compared to Calendar Year-End 2019 or 15.17%.
- Protective service occupations is a large occupational group that encompasses various sub-groups, such as police officers, firefighters, animal control workers, correctional officers employed by various industries and public sector, and first-line supervisors in the group.
- It is estimated that during Calendar Year 2021, in Nevada 44,476 workers will be employed in protective service occupations across all industries who earn a a mean wage of \$23.26 per hour or \$48,370 per year. This occupational group is projected to reach 46,350 by the end of CY2028 or 4.21%. The estimate for correctional officers and jailers and first-line supervisors of this subgroup for this calendar year is 3,114 who earn a mean hourly wage of \$31.33 and an annual salary of \$58,340, both above the US hourly wage of \$26.01 and yearly salary of \$54,115 for the correctional and jail officer group.
- For Fiscal Year 2021, the Nevada Legislature authorized 910 non-custody and 1,910 custody full-time positions, a decrease of 2 from Fiscal Year 2020. At the end of March 2021, 1,669 security and 861 non-security positions were filled. Filled positions were below budgeted positions for various reasons, such as the ability to recruit officers in remote areas of the state, retirements, and the hiring freeze instituted in March 2020 to help reduce the budget short-fall caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.







- From 2019 to 20120the size of the U.S. and Nevada populations increased by 0.37%.
- ➤ The largest increase in crime in Nevada was in arson, with the rate rising 47.87%; and , while for the U.S., the greatest increase was in homicide rising by 27.45%.
- ➤ The most outstanding decline in Nevada was the decreased in the burglary crime crime rate of 27.07% and in the US. the greatest decline was observed in larceny, which declined by 10.91%.
- ➤ Nevada shares common characteristics with all of the U.S. in that property is the major crime category and homicide the lowest.
- Crime rates in Nevada were as low as 5.7 per 100,000 inhabitants for homocide and as large as 1,926.6 per 100,000 inhabitants for property crime.
- ➤ In all of the U.S. homocide was as low of 6.5 per 100,000 inhabitants and property crime as large as 1,958.2 per 100,000.
