<sup>1</sup>The total population "base" forecast was derived by the JFA Institute in February, 2021. The "base" forecast is derived by a set of optimistic assumptions, such as low levels of new commitments, higher than historical mandatory parole release rates, and select sentencing reforms resulting from the enactment of Assembly Bill 236 during 2019 Legislative Session. In addition to the assumptions associated with reforms, the COVID-19 pandemic is expected to cause significant volatility in month-to-month change. During the first few years of the ten-year forecast horizon, NDOC expects a significant decline in inmate movement activity which will eventually reverse itself and finally normalize.

<sup>2</sup>The total population minus the population on escape, residential confinement, or serving sentences out of state on interstate compact programs equals the in-house population. The forecast for these counts beginning with February 2021 include downward adjustments to offset for the effect of a smaller in-house population affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic.

<sup>3</sup>The outcount is forecast by the NDOC for each budget phase.

<sup>4</sup>The outcount for the male population does not include individuals housed in contracted private facilities outside the Nevada prison system. Outsourced beds encompass one budget category and treated as if they were part of an additional unit in the in-state correctional system. Therefore, individuals in contracted facilities are included in the in-house population through October 2020, which is when the contract ended.
