Data Limitations:

Data published in this report were extracted from a live database; thus, it is possible that figures reported in tables and charts do not balance to totals reported in other reports published by the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC). Select distributions consist of estimates and are susceptible to rounding error and missing data that could have caused these distributions not to add up to exactly 100%. Current fiscal year data for the NDOC or for other agencies are not always available at time of edition; consequently, the NDOC performed its best effort to align data accordingly to derived estimates.



^b The NDOC must be able to identify offenders that fall in various age categories to determine the applicability of laws and regulations that are specific to the individual's actual age. Thus, Beginning with Fiscal Year 2016, age groups no longer encompass ages that are rounded down or up. The change in methodology may have caused a small shift in the frequencies that fall in each group relative to former editions of this report.






Distribution of Offenders by Race and Ethnicity In-house Population






Recidivism by County of Commitment


Female Population Projection Comparison State Fiscal Year 2020










Monthly Fluctuation in Prison Moves












Nevada Department of Corrections. Research, Planning, and Statistics. These figures compare Nevada's incarceration rate against the mean incarceration rate for the other 49 states in the nation. In summary, Nevada is 22.24 percentage points above their mean, and 22.74% of states in the nation have incarceration rates larger than Nevada's.



Summary of Macroeconomic and Employment Indicators

- The employment outlook for Nevada at the end of Fiscal Year 2020 didn't fare as well as prior quarters. At Fiscal-year-end 2019, Nevada's unemployment rate reached a one-time low of 4.0%, which is 2.0% below the natural rate. Unfortunately, the rate jumped to 15.0% by the end of June 2020, due to the pandemic created by COVID-19, and that resulted in a reduction of 194,954 persons employed after adjusting for seasonality. By the end of Calendar Year 2019, however, Nevadans per capita income increased by \$6,454 relative to the end of Calendar Year 2018.
- Protective service occupations is a large occupational group that encompasses various sub-groups, such as police officers, firefighters, animal control workers, and correctional officers employed by various industries and public sector.
- It is estimated that at year-end CY2016, 42,650 workers were employed in protective service occupations across all industries who earned a mean wage of \$21.42 per hour or \$46,980 per year. This occupational group was projected to reach 43,875 by the end of CY2019. The actual number of protective services workers fell short of the projection reaching 43,660, and it is projected that by the end of CY2021 it will rise by 1.87% and reach 44,476. NDOC assumes that employment dynamics will be subject to significant fluctuation, however, and deviate from historical trends given the recession that started in February 2020 and that resulted in the largest downturn in the U.S. economy since 1940.
- Correctional officers and jailers is a narrower occupational group among protective service workers, representing 2,940 employed persons as of CY2019 year-end, and that realized a year-over-year increase of 260 employed persons. Correctional officers and jailers in Nevada earn a mean wage of \$30.33 or \$63,090 per year- a wage that is above the \$24.10 or \$50,130 per year earned by the same type of workers in the U.S. as a whole. This wage includes overtime and police and fighter retirement compensation.
- For SFY 2020, the Nevada Legislature authorized 912 non-custody and 1,910 custody full-time positions, an increase of 36 positions from SFY 2019. As of the end of the fiscal year, 1,740 and 900 positions were filled, respectively. Filled positions were below budgeted positions for various reasons, such as the ability to recruit officers in remote areas of the


- ➤ From 2018 to 2019 the size of the U.S. population increased by 0.48% while Nevada's increased by 1.51%.
- ➤ In Nevada, the largest decline was in murder and manslaughter (-31.34%), while for the U.S. the greatest decline was in burglary crime (-9.92%).
- Crime rates in Nevada were as low as 4.6 per 100,000 inhabitants for murder and manslatugher and as large as 2,321 per 100,000 for property crime.
- ➤ In all of the U.S. murder and manslaughter was as low as 5.0 per 100,000 inhabitants and property crime as large as 2,109.9 per 100,000.
- Nevada shares common characteristics with all of the U.S. in that property and larceny are the two major UCR crimes. Violent crime and rape rates, however, are more pronounced in Nevada, while larceny-theft crime is more pronounced in the U.S. as a
