
Data published in this report were extracted from a live database; thus, it is possible that figures reported in tables and charts do not balance to totals reported in other reports published by the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC). Select distributions consist of estimates and are susceptible to rounding error and missing data that could have caused these distributions not to add up to exactly 100%. Current fiscal year data for the NDOC or for other agencies are not always available at time of edition; consequently, the NDOC performed its best effort to align data accordingly to derived estimates.

Unless specified, figures in this report are retrieved from the Nevada Department of Corrections InfoView data warehouse and from the Nevada Department of Corrections Offender Tracking System (NOTIS).

^b The NDOC must be able to identify offenders that fall in various age categories to determine the applicability of laws and regulations that are specific to the individual's actual age. Thus, Beginning with Fiscal Year 2016, age groups no longer encompass ages that are rounded down or up. The change in methodology may have caused a small shift in the frequencies that fall in each group relative to former editions of this report.




Recidivism by County of Commitment


Female Population Projection Comparison State Fiscal Year 2021










Monthly Fluctuation in Prison Moves






Summary of Macroeconomic and Employment Indicators

- The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate of 12.7% during the third quarter of Calendar Year 2020 12.7%, a 17% drop from the second quarter, was a reflection of the effect of the COVID-19 Pandemic. The crisis significantly affected many service occupations in Nevada's hospitality and retail industries.
- Per capita personal income was down 5.69% during the third quarter relative to the second quarter, but up 2.61% relative to the first quarter.
- Protective service occupations is a large occupational group that encompasses various sub-groups, such as police officers, firefighters, animal control workers, correctional officers employed by various industries and public sector, and first-line supervisors in the group. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, this occupational group is expected to increase 4.5% through 2024.
- According to the Nevada Department of Employment, Training, and Rehabilitation, this protective service occupational group was expected to employ 38,724 individuals, with 2,809 specifically working as correctional officers and jailers, representing between 0.18% and 0.19% of total employment in Nevada.
- According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, correctional officers and jailers in Nevada earned a mean hourly wage of \$31.33 and a mean annual salary of \$65,170, fairing 24.52% better than the national average.
- For Fiscal Year 2021, the 2019 Nevada Legislature authorized 912 non-custody and 1,910 custody full-time positions, a decrease of 2 from Fiscal Year 2020. At the end of September 2020, 1,715 security and 875 non-security positions were filled. Filled positions were below budgeted positions for various reasons, such as the ability to recruit officers in remote areas of the state, retirements, and the hiring freeze instituted in March 2020 to help reduce the budget short-fall caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.







- From 2019 to 2020 the size of the U.S. and Nevada populations increased by 0.37%.
- ➤The largest increase in crime in Nevada was in arson, with the rate rising 47.87%; and , while for the U.S., the greatest increase was in homicide rising by 27.45%.
- ➤ The most outstanding decline in Nevada was the decreased in the burglary crime crime rate of 27.07% and in the US. the greatest decline was observed in larceny, which declined by 10.91%.
- ➤ Nevada shares common characteristics with all of the U.S. in that property is the major crime category and homicide the lowest.
- Crime rates in Nevada were as low as 5.7 per 100,000 inhabitants for homocide and as large as 1,926.6 per 100,000 inhabitants for property crime.
- ➤ In all of the U.S. homocide was as low of 6.5 per 100,000 inhabitants and property crime as large as 1,958.2 per 100,000.
