The Nevada Department of Corrections Director James Dzurenda announces John Borrowman has been appointed to the position of Deputy Director of Support Services in Carson City.

Early in his career, Borrowman dedicated twelve years to the building materials distribution industry which brought him to Carson City in 1998 to manage the former Carson Building Supply. His time with the state of Nevada began in 2001, when he was hired as a Management Analyst 4 and worked assisting with the implementation of new quality care incentives for Medicaid. Soon Borrowman moved his financial administration expertise into the law enforcement realm by accepting the position of Chief Financial Officer with the Department of Public Safety, Highway Patrol Division.

In 2008, Borrowman joined the Executive Budget Office as an analyst and served as lead administrator for the Nevada Executive Budget System (NEBS) where he managed the development and implementation of the Contract Enterprise Tracking System (CETS), the State Fiscal Year End (SFYE) module and the Bill Draft Request (BDR) module among other projects.

In September 2015, Borrowman returned to working with law enforcement by accepting the position of Chief of Fiscal Services for the Nevada Department of Corrections. He brings a unique perspective from private and public sectors, as well as extensive experience with contract development and financial administration. He began as Deputy Director of Support Services Monday, July 18, 2016.

Borrowman has a Bachelor's of Arts in Economics with an emphasis in mathematics from Idaho State University.
