UPDATE: Inmate Back In Custody

The Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC) reports inmate Jeffrey Pimental #1128043, who walked away from a Conservation Camp last week, has been recaptured. January 27th at approximately 10:20 AM, Investigators from the NDOC Inspector General's Office located Pimental in an apartment building in the Summerlin area of Las Vegas, Nevada. The investigators called him out of the apartment and Pimental surrendered without incident. He was transported to High Desert State Prison where he will remain as he faces further charges.

Walk Away from Three Lakes Valley Conservation Camp

The Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC) reports that at approximately 6:00 PM January 20, 2018, a minimum security male inmate was reported missing from Three Lakes Valley Conservation Camp located approximately thirty miles north of Las Vegas, Nevada. It is believed he walked away from the camp and was picked up by a driver in a vehicle nearby.

Inmate Jeffrey Pimental, #1128043, a 46 year old Hispanic male, arrived at NDOC from Clark County, April 6, 2017. Pimental was serving 29 to 60 months for Battery with a Deadly Weapon was last seen wearing prison blue denim pants with a blue shirt and white tennis shoes.

Pimental is 5 feet 9 inches tall, 180 pounds with brown eyes, dark brown hair and is heavily tattooed over his body including his face, possibly more than in this photo. A re-take warrant has been issued. Anyone with information on the whereabouts of Jeffrey Pimental, please contact 911 or their local law enforcement agency.

NDOC partners with the Nevada Division of Forestry to run 9 Conservation Camps in the state. The camps are for minimum security inmates who are scheduled to be released within two years. Inmates in the camps are trained to fight wildland fires and are deployed to handle weed abatement, highway clean-up and other jobs when in the off season. Over 500 inmates assisted with sandbagging and other jobs during the recent flooding in Northern Nevada.
