Walk Away from Work Crew at Torrey Pines

The Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC) reports that at approximately 10:00 AM, July 13, 2018, a minimum security male inmate walked away from a clean-up crew working in the area of West Lake Mead Blvd and Torrey Pines Avenue in Las Vegas. The inmate was housed at Three Lakes Valley Conservation Camp located approximately thirty miles north of Las Vegas, Nevada. It is believed he walked away from the work crew.

Inmate Jason White, #1155155, a 37 year old male, arrived at NDOC from Clark County, December 08, 2017. White was serving 38 to 120 months for Larceny, Burglary, Domestic Battery and Ex-Felon in Possession of a Firearm. Inmate was last seen wearing prison blue pants with a blue shirt and black work boots.

White is 6 feet tall, 215 pounds with brown eyes, shaved head and is tattooed with the word "Trystan" on his neck, a swastika on his chest, "Swastika Power" on his right arm and a tiger, skull and tree trunk on his left arm. A re-take warrant has been issued. Anyone with information on the whereabouts of Jason White, please contact 911 or their local law enforcement agency.

NDOC partners with the Nevada Division of Forestry to run 9 Conservation Camps in the state. The camps are for minimum security inmates who are scheduled to be released within two years. Inmates in the camps are trained to fight wildland fires and are deployed to handle weed abatement, highway clean-up and other jobs when in the off season. Over 500 inmates assisted with sandbagging and other jobs during the recent flooding in Northern Nevada.
