The change in methodology may have caused a small shift in the frequencies that fall in each group relative to former editions of this report.


Data Limitations:

Data published in this report were extracted from a live database; thus, it is possible that figures reported in tables and charts do not balance to totals reported in other reports published by the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC). Select distributions consist of estimates and are susceptible to rounding error and missing data that could have caused these distributions not to add up to exactly 100%. Current fiscal year data for the NDOC or for other agencies are not always available at time of edition; consequently, the NDOC performed its best effort to align data accordingly to derived estimates.

Unless specified, figures in this report are retrieved from the Nevada Department of Corrections InfoView data warehouse and from the Nevada Department of Corrections Offender Tracking System (NOTIS).

Distribution of Offenders by Race and Correctional Location



Distribution of Offenders by Ethnicity and Correctional Location



Female Population Projection Comparison State Fiscal Year 2023










Monthly Fluctuation in Prison Moves






Summary of Macroeconomic and Employment Indicators

- Unemployment slightly increased in quarter 4, raining to 4.75% from 4.40% in quarter 3. This comes after a long period of decreasing unemployment. However, unemployment still remains below its level from quarter 4 of 2021, and even quarter 2 of 2022.
- Per Capita income has increased from \$60,186 in quarter 2 of 2022 to \$61,506 in quarter 3. This is after a period of relative stagnation, with per capita income hovering around \$59,500 for several previous quarters.
- Protective service occupations is a large occupational group that encompasses various sub-groups, such as police officers, fireflighters, animal control workers, correctional officers employed by various industries and public sector, and first-line supervisors in the group.
- It is estimated that during Calendar Year 2021, in Nevada 44,476 workers will be employed in protective service occupations across all industries who earn a a mean wage of \$23.26 per hour or \$48,370 per year. This occupational group is projected to reach 46,350 by the end of CY2028, an increase or 4.21%. The estimate for correctional officers and jailers and first-line supervisors of this subgroup for this calendar year was revised downward from 3,114 to 2,809. The most current earnings data available is as of May 2020, reflects that correctional officers and jailers earn a mean hourly wage of \$31.33 and an annual salary of \$58,340, both above the US hourly wage of \$26.01 and yearly salary of \$54,115 for the correctional and jail officer group.
- As of December 30, 2022, the Nevada Department of Corrections was authorized for 1045 non-custody and 1874 custody full-time equivalent personnel.
- On December 30, 2022, 738 non-security and 1264 security positions were filled by NDOC. Both non-security and security
 personnel positions are below permitted levels. There has been continued difficulty hiring and retaining all personnel due to
 retirements, departures of recruits and current staff for other positions, and other personal reasons.


- > From 2019 to 2020 the size of the U.S. and Nevada populations increased by 0.005% and 0.79%, respectively.
- The largest increase in crime in Nevada was in arson, with the rate rising 47.87%, while for the U.S., the greatest increase was in homicide rising by 27.45%.
- ➤The most outstanding decline in Nevada was the decreased in the burglary crime crime rate of 27.07% and in the US. the greatest decline was observed in rape, which declined by 10.91%.
- Nevada shares common characteristics with all of the U.S. in that property is the most common major crime category and homicide the least common.
