Thus, Beginning with Fiscal Year 2016, age groups no longer encompass ages that are rounded down or up. The change in methodology may have caused a small shift in the frequencies that fall in each group relative to former editions of this report.

Data Limitations:

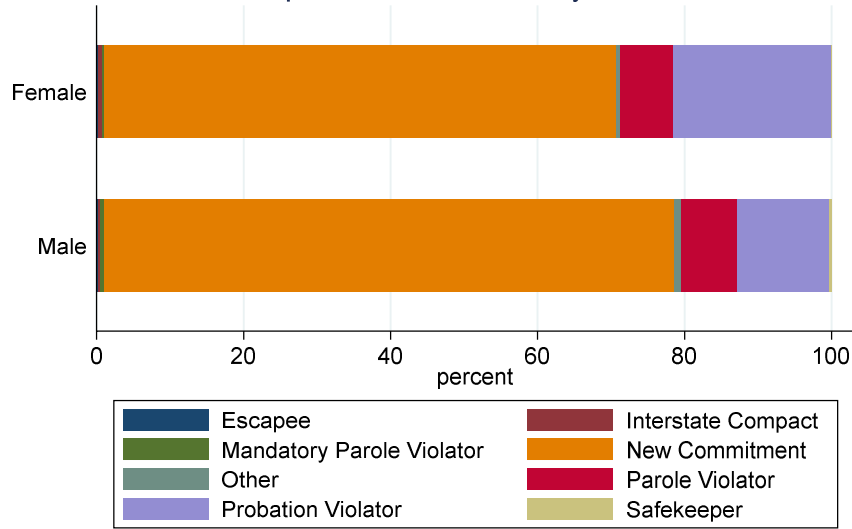
Data published in this report were extracted from a live database; thus, it is possible that figures reported in tables and charts do not balance to totals reported in other reports published by the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC). Select distributions consist of estimates and are susceptible to rounding error and missing data that could have caused these distributions not to add up to exactly 100%. Current fiscal year data for the NDOC or for other agencies are not always available at time of edition; consequently, the NDOC performed its best effort to align data accordingly to derived estimates.

Unless specified, figures in this report are retrieved from the Nevada Department of Corrections InfoView data warehouse and from the Nevada Department of Corrections Offender Tracking System (NOTIS).

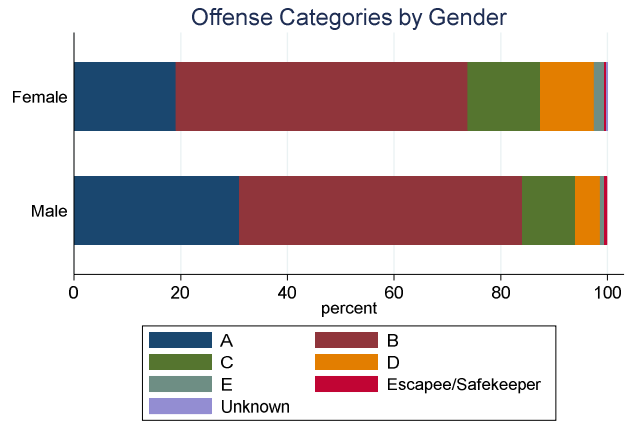
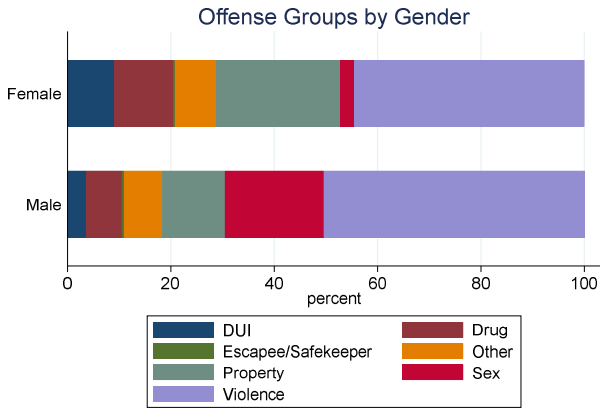
Imprisonment Status by Gender

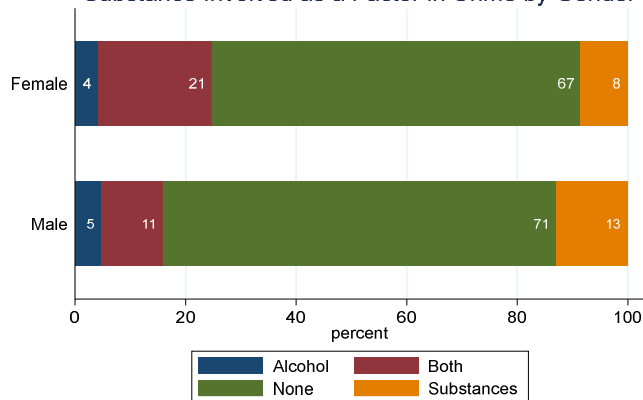

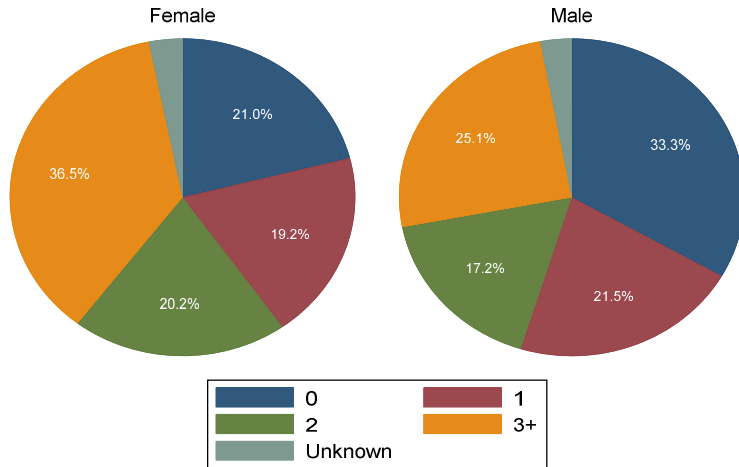
Substance Involved as a Factor in Crime by Gender

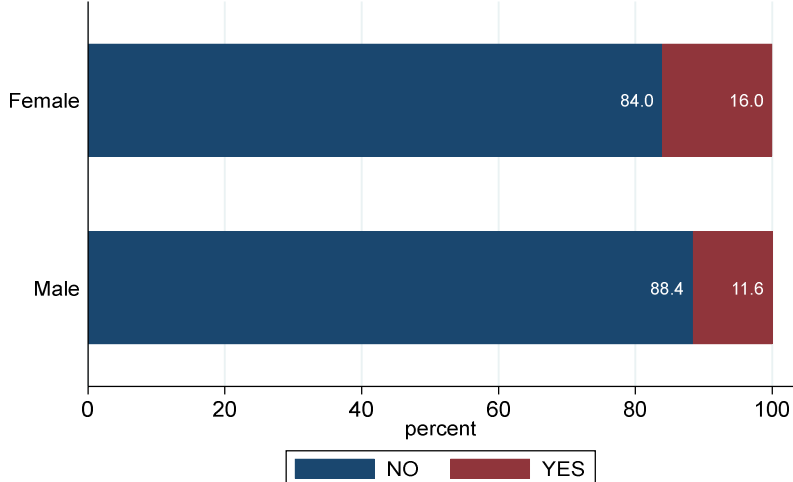

Distribution of Offenders by Race and Correctional Location

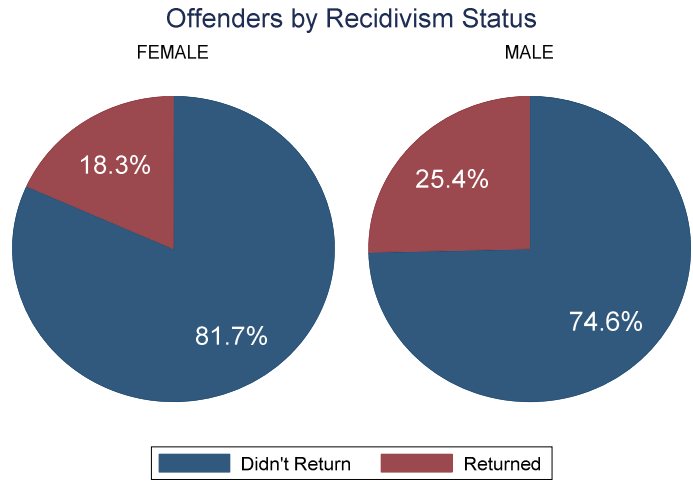

Distribution of Offenders by Ethnicity and Correctional Location

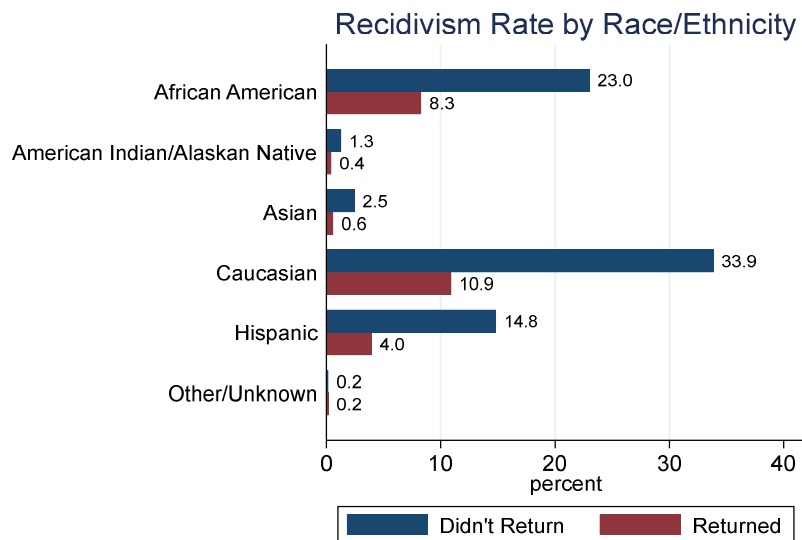

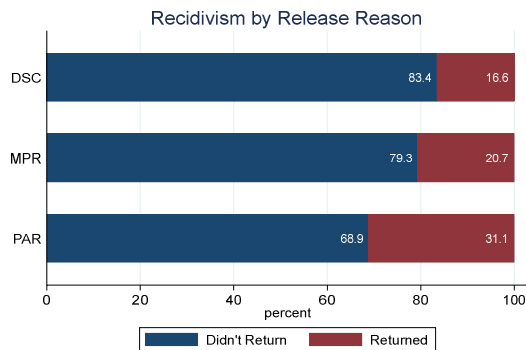


Recidivism by County of Commitment

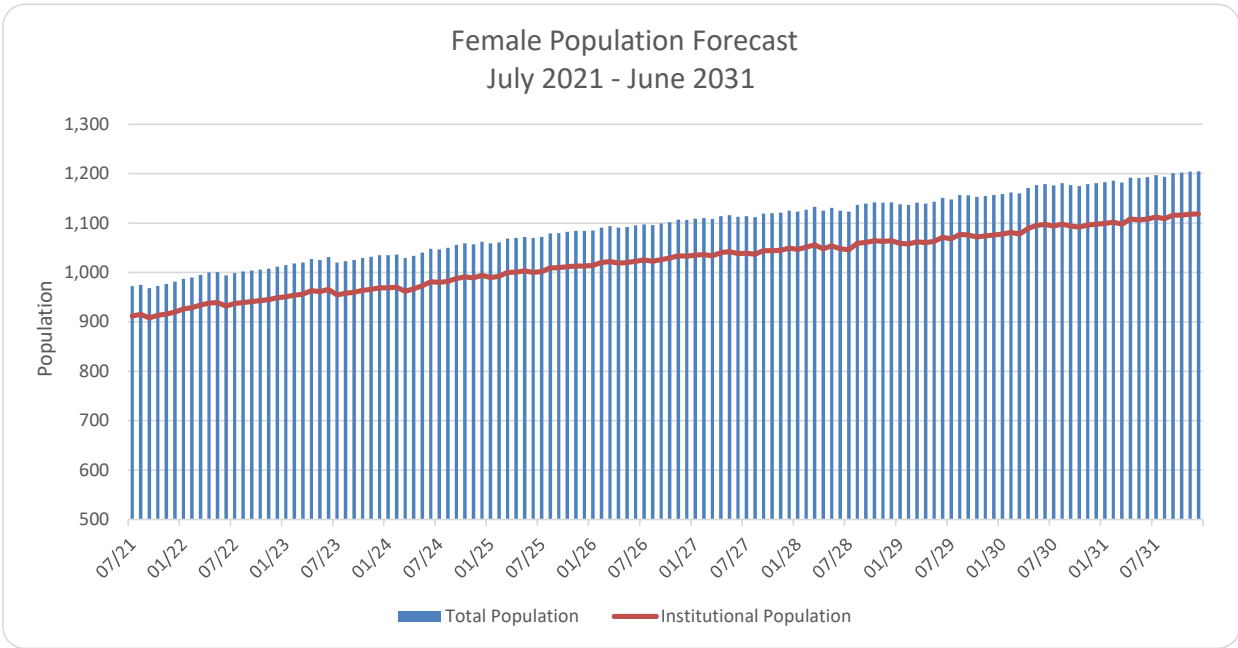
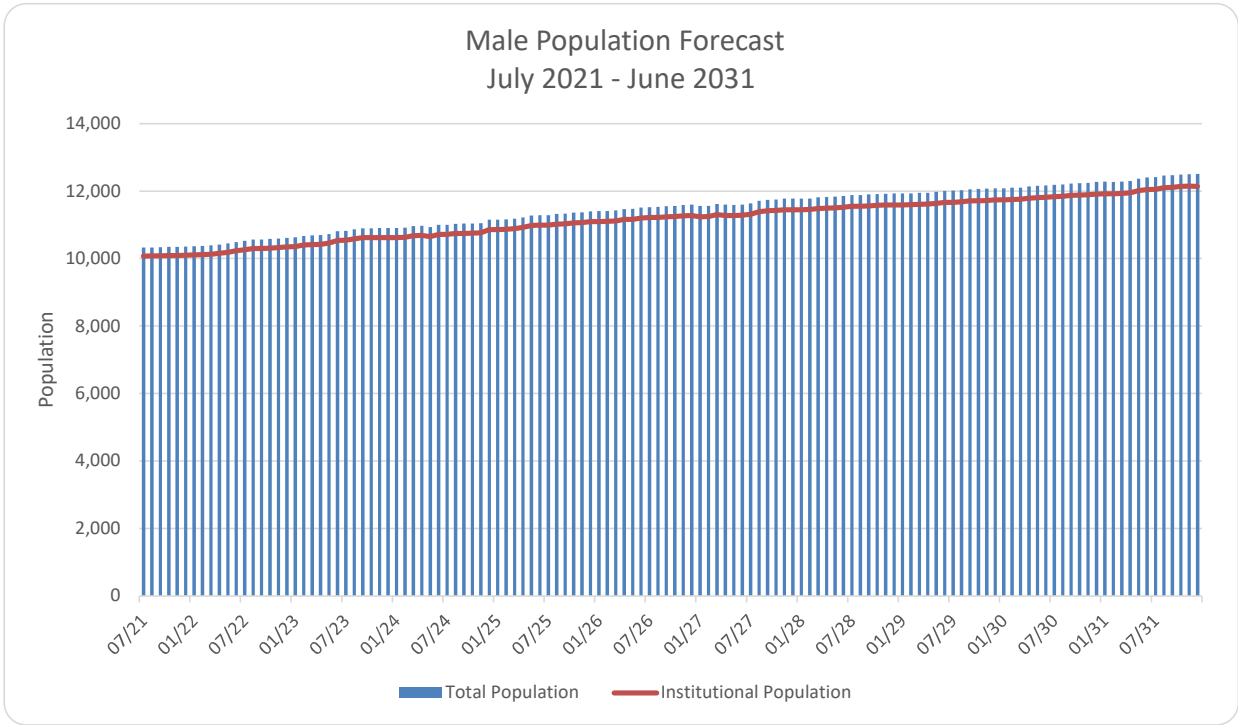
Female Population Projection Comparison State Fiscal Year 2023

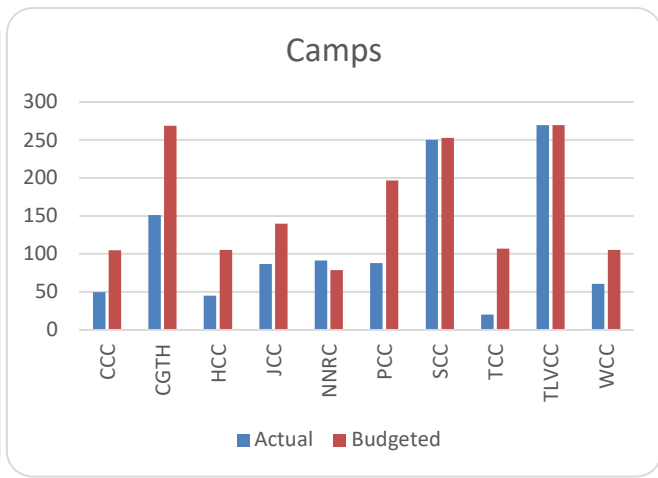
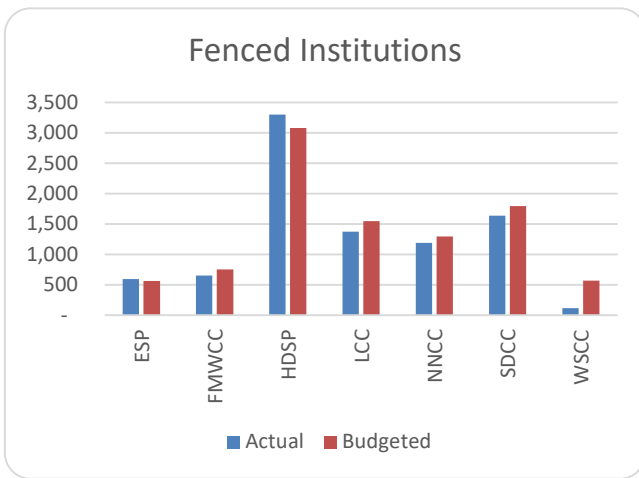

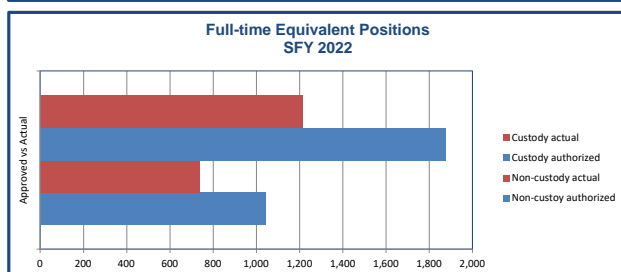

Summary of Macroeconomic and Employment Indicators

- Unemployment stayed level in quarter 1 of 2023, compared to quarter 4 of 2022, at 5.5%. This comes after a long period of decreasing unemployment. Unemployment is slightly higher than it was in quarter 1 of 2022, which was 5.33%.
- Per Capita income has increased from \$59,577 in quarter 1 of 2022 to \$62,935 in quarter 4. This is after a period of relative stagnation, with per capita income hovering around \$59,500 for several previous quarters.
- Protective service occupations is a large occupational group that encompasses various sub-groups, such as police officers, firefighters, animal control workers, correctional officers employed by various industries and public sector, and first-line supervisors in the group.
- It is estimated that during Calendar Year 2022, in Nevada 43,910 workers will be employed in protective service occupations across all industries, who earn a mean wage of \$23.48 per hour or \$48,830 per year. The estimate for correctional officers and jailers and first-line supervisors for 2022 was 3096. The most current earnings data available reflects that correctional officers and jailers earn a mean hourly wage of \$31.28 and an annual salary of \$60,780, both above the US hourly wage of \$25.69 and yearly salary of \$53,420 for the correctional and jail officer group. The same pattern is true for first-line supervisors.
- As of March 31, 2023, the Nevada Department of Corrections was authorized for 1045 non-custody and 1876 custody full-time equivalent personnel.
- On March 24, 2022, 734 non-security and 1216 security full-time-equivalent positions were filled by NDOC. Both non-security and security personnel positions are below permitted levels. There has been continued difficulty hiring and retaining all personnel due to retirements, departures of recruits and current staff for other positions, and other personal reasons.

- ▶ From 2019 to 2020 the size of the U.S. and Nevada populations increased by 0.005% and 0.79%, respectively.
- ▶ The largest increase in crime in Nevada was in arson, with the rate rising 47.87%, while for the U.S., the greatest increase was in homicide, rising by 31.37%.
- ▶ The most outstanding decline in Nevada was the decreased in the rape rate, falling by 44.91%; likewise, in the U.S. the greatest decline was also observed in rape, which declined by 27.98%.
- ▶ Nevada shares common characteristics with all of the U.S. in that property is the most common major crime category and homicide the least common.
- ▶ Crime rates in Nevada were as low as 5.7 per 100,000 inhabitants for homicide and as high as 2198.6 per 100,000 inhabitants for property crime.
- ▶ In the entire U.S. for 2020, homicide was as low of 6.7 per 100,000 inhabitants and property crime as high as 2025 per 100,000.
- ▶ Violent crime and rape rates are more pronounced in Nevada, while larceny-theft crime is more pronounced in the U.S. as a whole.

Violent crime includes the offenses of murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, rape (revised definition), robbery, and aggravated assault. Property crime includes the offenses of burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft.
