- Full-time-equivalent (FTE) positions are authorized with each fiscal year's budget approved by the Nevada Legislature each Legislative Session represent those supported by the General Fund; and NDOC's Inmate Store, Inmate Welfare, Prison Industries, and Dairy Farm. Active FTE position counts are reconciled weekly by NDOC's Human Resources Division. Current FTE counts are currently not available.
- Total and in-house population counts reflect the number of sentenced individuals housed in institutions in Nevada or in other states, and serving time on residential confinement. The counts are derived from NDOC's data warehouse.
- Daily operation costs of incarceration are authorized with each fiscal year's budget approved by the Nevada Legislature each Legislative Session.
- The custody distribution is as of the last day of each month for in-house offenders only. Some offenders are pending classification changes.
- Parole offender counts are provided by the Nevada Division of Parole and Probation at the beginning of each month.
- The ages represent the mean and 50th percentiles for the total population as of the date of the fact sheet and for the cumulative number of individuals admitted and released during the fiscal year. The mean and median will change by adding more data during the fiscal year.
- The distribution of total incarcerated individuals by sentence length category and long-term sentence type is retrieved from Report OMDSLB generated by Nevada Offender Tracking Information System (NOTIS) and represents the longest sentence currently being served by the offender.
- The NDOC has been gradually converting its offender population racial and ethnic group categories pursuant to the the U.S. Office of Management and Budget 1997 Standards for the Classification of Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity. These standards encompass a minimum of five racial groups and and Hispanic or Latino as a dichotomus ethnic category.

*Note: the figures presented in this report involve estimates derived from datasets extracted from NDOC's data warehouse as of midnight of the date of this fact sheet; thus, select counts may not match to numbers derived from reports produced by other software applications. Furthermore, select distributions may not add up to 100% due to rounding.*
