## WAITING LISTS FOR PROGRAMS

### **Education Programs**

- Nevada State Prison has 70 for the academic program and 20 for ESL. Reasons for waiting list include space for classes, losing 1 ½ positions, education is a way to get work credits.
- Southern Desert Correctional Center has 342 waiting which includes 86 for vocational and 43 for ESL. SDCC is not limiting the number of classes per inmate at this time
- High Desert State Prison said that in February there were 140 waiting for classes, but they have either been accommodated in the school or were transferred by NDOC to another facility.
- Florence McClure Women's Correctional Center has about 50 waiting form computer classes, but none for academics.
- Ely State Prison has no waiting list for education.
- Other principals indicated that the change to two classes for full time students has allowed them to enroll more inmates and eliminate waiting. Additionally, the time of year can change the numbers. Programs are not accepting new applications due to end of year.

### **DUI Program at Indian Springs Conservation Camp**

- No waiting list. AB510 eliminated requirement to attend class prior to placement on residential confinement. Since passage, Department has not been able to totally fill a class.

## **MAJOR INSTITUTIONS**

### High Desert State Prison

- Addictions Prevention: 256 inmates (w/transferred inmates: 308)
- Anger Management: 256 inmates (w/transferred inmates: 308)
- Commitment to Change I, II, III: 438 inmates (w/transferred inmates: 526)
- Inside/Outside Dads: 3 inmates (New program)
- Relationships: 4 inmates (New program)

Average wait time for program: eight weeks\*

\*Due to the fact that HDSP is an intake facility, these numbers do not include inmates that have requested programs and then have been transferred to different facilities. A 20-25% increase in these numbers would be appropriate if including inmates that have requested groups and during the time they were waiting for a group to open, were transferred to another NDOC facility.

### Florence McClure Women's Correctional Center

- ARCH: 27 inmates (average wait for program: two weeks)
- Seeking Safety: 30 inmates (average wait time for program: three to six months)
- STEPPS: 35 inmates (average wait time for program: six months to one year)

### Southern Desert Correctional Center - Facility does not currently utilize "wait lists"

The staff members at SDCC post sign-in sheets when new classes become available. These lists are typically filled in one to two days. In the past, it has been normal to receive two-three times the amount of requests for each group. If each staff member has 15-20 inmates sign-up for each group, it can be estimated that 30-60 inmates would typically be on a waiting list.

- Addictions Prevention: (Estimate: 120-240 would be on waiting list)
- Anger Management: (Estimate: 120-240 would be on waiting list)
- Commitment of Change I, II, III: (Estimate: 120-240 would be on waiting list)
- OASIS: (Estimate: 25-30 would be on waiting list with a one to two day wait time)
- STOP/Phase I: No current wait time
- STOP/Phase II (10-20 inmates on waiting list – new program)

### Southern Nevada Correctional Center – Scheduled to close

- Addictions Prevention: 45 inmates (average wait time for program: eight weeks)
- ANCHOR: 125 inmates (average wait time for program: four to eight weeks)
- Anger Management: 30 inmates (average wait time for program: eight weeks)
- Commitment to Change I, II, III: 30 inmates (average wait time for program: eight weeks)
- New Beginnings: 60 inmates (average wait time for program: seven weeks)

### Ely State Prison – maximum security institution

- No waiting lists for programs. On occasion, limited waits occur.

### Northern Nevada Correctional Center

Many programs have lengthy waiting list as all programs are instructed on an on-going basis. Major problem.

- OASIS: nine on waiting list with less than a month wait time
- STOP: 32 on wait list with less than a month wait time
- Commitment to Change I, II, III: 26 inmates with 528 on wait list
- Substance Abuse: 16 inmates with 221 on wait list
- Relationship Skills: 0 inmates with 248 on wait list
- Communications: 0 inmates with 265 on wait list
- Conflict Resolution: 0 inmates with 264 on wait list

### **Nevada State Prison**

- Anger Management: 69 inmates with 51 on wait list
- Commitment to Change I, II, III: 64 inmates with 76 on wait list
- Substance Abuse: 66 inmates with 104 on wait list
- STOP: 34 inmates with 95 on wait list

### **Lovelock Correctional Center**

- SOS Help For Emotions: 20 inmates with 101 on wait list
- Commitment to Change I, II, III: 41 inmates with 188 on wait list
- Substance Abuse: 53 inmates with 250 on wait list
- STOP: 75 inmates with 701 on wait list

### **Warm Springs Correctional Center**

- Anger Management: 31 inmates with 98 on wait list
- Parenting/Family: 19 inmates with 90 on wait list
- Substance Abuse: 19 inmates with 90 on wait list

### **Silver Springs Conservation Camp**

- Anger Management: 0 inmates with 46 on wait list
- Commitment to Change I, II, III: 0 inmates with 54 on wait list
- Substance Abuse: 0 inmates with 34 on wait list
- New Beginnings: 0 inmates with 53 on wait list

- ❖ Group Wait Time depends upon projected release date: priority given to those who are to be release soonest.
- ❖ Average wait time per group is currently three months for NNCC, NSP, LCC and WSCC.
- ❖ STOP C-base program at LCC is available upon request. STOP is offered during last two years of sentence.
- ❖ SCC Program begins in July and will be prioritized by projected release date and program demand.
