HEALTH CARE FOR WOMEN ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION – 623

AUTHORITY: NRS 209.131; NRS 209.381; NRS 209.385

RESPONSIBILITY

The Director of the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC and Department) is responsible for the implementation of this Administrative Regulation (AR).

The Wardens will ensure that their appropriate assigned subordinate supervisors have read and understand this regulation.

The Associate Wardens will ensure that their appropriate assigned subordinate supervisors have read and understand this regulation.

Supervisors will ensure that their appropriate subordinate staff members have read and understand this regulation.

Designated staff members will know, comply with, and enforce this regulation.

If, and where applicable, offenders will know and comply with this regulation.

623.01 HEALTH CARE FOR WOMEN

- 1. Female <u>inmate offender</u> will be provided appropriate medical care to include screening, diagnostic, therapeutic, and supportive care for those medical problems unique to women. Specific health services available to female <u>inmates offenders</u> include:
 - A. Care for the pregnant inmate offender (Prenatal, intrapartum, and postpartum care).

- B. Birthing in an appropriate setting.
- C. Family planning counseling may be included prior to release from prison.
- D. Gynecology consultations and/or procedures indicated for the prevention or treatment of a serious medical condition.
- E. Health maintenance examinations proven to be beneficial in treating or preventing serious medical conditions.

APPLICABILITY

- 1. This regulation requires a Medical Directive for care of the female inmate offender.
- 2. This regulation requires an audit.
