LCC sponsors a Peace Corps volunteer, Gracie Geremia, a community education specialist near Solwezi, Zambia, with shipments of clothing and school supplies and they also collect school supplies, back packs, etc. for low income children in Pershing County. Since the Lovelock Correctional Center opened in 1995, the staff have become part of Pershing County and the surrounding communities by serving on county boards, becoming church leaders, coaching wrestling, baseball, football and soccer, and chairing teams for fundraising events such as Relay For Life (ACS).
