The Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC) reports that this morning approximately 5:30 am two minimum security female inmates were discovered to have walked away from Jean Conservation Camp located approximately 33 miles South of Las Vegas.


Inmate Krystal Smith, #1167990, a 32 year old female, arrived at NDOC from Clark County, November 8, 2016, and was transferred to Jean Conservation Camp January 31, 2017. Smith was serving 18 to 48 months for Attempted Possession of a Stolen Vehicle. She is 5 feet 2 inches tall, 125 lbs, hazel eyes, dark hair with a fair complexion. Smith has "Mrs. Romero", "Sabrina" and "K" tattoos on her neck.

Inmate Danielle First, #1135716, a 22 year old female, arrived at NDOC from Carson City County, March 17, 2015. She was released to parole November 24, 2015, violated and was re-arrested September 26, 2016 to return to NDOC custody October 7, 2016. Inmate First moved to Jean Conservation Camp on December 13, 2016 and was serving 12 to 48 months for Grand Larceny. She is 5 feet 6 inches tall, with green eyes, brown hair and has a fair complexion with tattoos including the name "Leanna" on her right forearm, and others on her left upper arm and back of her neck. She is known to dye her hair blonde (see photo attached.)

Both inmates were last seen wearing blue and or white clothing. Anyone with information on whereabouts of Krystal Smith or Danielle First, please contact 911 or their local law enforcement agency.

NDOC partners with the Nevada Division of Forestry to run 9 Conservation Camps in the state. The camps are for minimum security inmates who are scheduled to be released within two years. Inmates in the camps are trained to fight wildland fires and are deployed to handle weed abatement, highway clean-up and other jobs when in the off season. Over 500 inmates assisted with sandbagging and other jobs during the recent flooding in Northern Nevada.
