
Data published in this report were extracted from a live database; thus, it is possible that figures reported in tables and charts do not balance to totals reported in other reports published by the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC). Select distributions consist of estimates and are susceptible to round data that could have caused these distributions not to add up to exactly 100%. Current fiscal year data for the NDOC or for other agencies are not always available at time of edition; consequently, the NDOC performed its best effort to align data accordingly to derived estimates.

Unless specified, figures in this report are retrieved from the Nevada Department of Corrections InfoView data warehouse and from the Nevada Department of Corrections Offender Tracking System (NOTIS).




**Distribution of Offenders by Race and Ethnicity




### Recidivism by County of Commitment



## Female Population Projection Comparison State Fiscal Year 2021






### Summary of Macroeconomic and Employment Indicators

- During the second and third quarters of Calendar Year 2020, the unemployment rate increased from a low 4% at the end of Calendar Year 2019 to 13% and 15%. During the first quarter of Calendar Year 2021, the labor market improved considerably as it rebounded from the effect of the COVID-19 pandemic by declining to 8.10%. The seasonally adjusted number of persons employed was still behind 54,699 relative to the pre-pandemic level.
- Despite the recessionary impact of the pandemic, per-capita income in Nevada increased \$7,760 dollars compared to Calendar Year-End 2019 or 15.17%.
- Protective service occupations is a large occupational group that encompasses various sub-groups, such as police officers, firefighters, animal control workers, correctional officers employed by various industries and public sector, and first-line supervisors in the group.
- It is estimated that during Calendar Year 2021, in Nevada 44,476 workers will be employed in protective service occupations across all industries who earn a mean wage of \$23.26 per hour or \$48,370 per year. This occupational group is projected to reach 46,350 by the end of CY2028 or 4.21%. The estimate for correctional officers and jailers and first-line supervisors of this subgroup for this calendar year is 3,114 who earn a mean hourly wage of \$31.33 and an annual salary of \$58,340, both above the US hourly wage of \$26.01 and yearly salary of \$54,115 for the correctional and jail officer group.
- For Fiscal Year 2021, the Nevada Legislature authorized 910 non-custody and 1,910 custody full-time positions, a decrease of 2 from Fiscal Year 2020. At the end of March 2021, 1,669 security and 861 non-security positions were filled. Filled positions were below budgeted positions for various reasons, such as the ability to recruit officers in remote areas of the state, retirements, and the hiring freeze instituted in March 2020 to help reduce the budget short-fall caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.





➤ From 2018 to 2019 the size of the U.S. population increased by 0.48% while Nevada's increased by 1.51%.

➤ In Nevada, the largest decline was in murder and manslaughter (-31.34%), while for the U.S. the greatest decline was in burglary crime (-9.92%).

➤ Crime rates in Nevada were as low as 4.6 per 100,000 inhabitants for murder and manslaughter and as large as 2,321 per 100,000 for property crime.

➤ In all of the U.S. murder and manslaughter was as low as 5.0 per 100,000 inhabitants and property crime as large as 2,109.9 per 100,000.

➤ Nevada shares common characteristics with all of the U.S. in that property and larceny are the two major UCR crimes. Violent crime and rape rates, however, are more pronounced in Nevada, while larceny-theft crime is more pronounced in the U.S. as a
