**Model Purpose**

1. To incorporate the most current correctional population forecast.
2. To create sufficient long-range bed capacity to accommodate the male correctional population forecast.
- 3 To open the following housing: a new unit and a death chamber at ESP, Northern Nevada Transitional Center (NNTC), and the southern Nevada RMF.

**Model Assumptions and Conditions**

1. The male, in-house correctional population will increase by 488 offenders from Fiscal Year End 2013 to Fiscal Year End 2023, or at a rate of .43% per fiscal year. The in-house forecast adjusts the stock forecast by reducing it by the proportion of offenders not expected to reside at the NDOC over the upcoming 120 months of the forecast horizon.
2. The male correctional population outcount (the proportion of offenders not residing at an NDOC location) is expected to represent, on the average, 2.199% of the total male population from Fiscal Year 2013 through Fiscal Year end 2023. Historical series were utilized to derive the forecast.
3. The beginning beds balance to the most current capacity analysis for the fiscal year in the plan.
4. The custody distribution was projected for the period Fiscal Year End 2013 through Fiscal Year 2015, then averaged, and applied to the model. The assumption is that the custody distribution stays constant and future fluctuation will be incorporated during upcoming budget phases.

Custody is categorized in the following manner:

The populations in minimum and community assignments are combined into minimum custody.  
 The populations in maximum and close custodies are combined into close custody.

The distribution applied to the model is as follows:

5. The model assumes that release rates and sentencing laws will stay constant throughout the forecast horizon.
