

Data Limitations:

Data published in this report were extracted from a live database; thus, it is possible that figures reported in tables and chart do not balance to totals reported in other reports published by the Department of Corrections. Select distributions consist of estimates and are susceptible to rounding error and missing data which could have caused these distributions not to add up to exactly 100%. Current fiscal year data for the NDOC or for other agencies are not always available at time of edition; consequently, the NDOC performed its best effort to align data accordingly to derive estimates.

DISTRIBUTION OF IN-HOUSE OFFENDERS BY ETHNICITY AND CORRECTIONAL SITE





This factor is believed to be the result of, among other factors, declining birth rates, a higher unemployed population staying at home hindering thieves and other crime activity, or residents moving to other states to seek other work opportunities.

The Nevada Department of Corrections offers several educational and vocational programs and work opportunities for its offender population with the intent of providing them gainful skills while incarcerated and upon release.

The performance of the economy, mass layoffs, and the lack of work opportunities could potentially have an impact on ex-offenders who are seeking work opportunities, and, in turn, lead to higher recidivism.
