





^a The NDOC must be able to identify offenders that fall in various age categories to determine the applicability of laws and regulations that are specific to the individual's actual age. Thus, Beginning with Fiscal Year 2016, age groups no longer encompass ages that are rounded down or up. The change in methodology may have caused a small shift in the frequencies that fall in each group relative to former editions of this report.

Data Limitations:


Data published in this report were extracted from a live database; thus, it is possible that figures reported in tables and charts do not balance to totals reported in other reports published by the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC). Select distributions consist of estimates and are susceptible to rounding error and missing data that could have caused these distributions not to add up to exactly 100%. Current fiscal year data for the NDOC or for other agencies are not always available at time of edition; consequently, the NDOC performed its best effort to align data accordingly to derived estimates.

Unless specified, figures in this report are retrieved from the Nevada Department of Corrections InfoView data warehouse and from the Nevada Department of Corrections Offender Tracking System (NOTIS).










Veteran Status by Gender




Substance Involved as a Factor in Crime by Gender



Offenders Previously in Foster Care by Gender









Number of Prior Felonies by Recidivism Status




Habitual Offenders by Recidivism Status





Female Population Projection Comparison State Fiscal Year 2023






Summary of Macroeconomic and Employment Indicators

- Unemployment has continued to fall, dropping to 6.07% unemployment on average for the 3 months of quarter 3, 2021 to 4.4% in quarter 3 of 2022, with a steady and consistent decline over this period. This is still slightly above the pre-pandemic level of 3.7%.
- Per-capita income has remained steady, at \$59,557 in the third quarter of 2021 and slightly increasing to \$60,186 in the second quarter of 2022.
- Protective service occupations is a large occupational group that encompasses various sub-groups, such as police officers, firefighters, animal control workers, correctional officers employed by various industries and public sector, and first-line supervisors in the group.
- It is estimated that during Calendar Year 2021, in Nevada 44,476 workers will be employed in protective service occupations across all industries who earn a mean wage of \$23.26 per hour or \$48,370 per year. This occupational group is projected to reach 46,350 by the end of CY2028, an increase of 4.21%. The estimate for correctional officers and jailers and first-line supervisors of this subgroup for this calendar year was revised downward from 3,114 to 2,809. The most current earnings data available is as of May 2020, reflects that correctional officers and jailers earn a mean hourly wage of \$31.33 and an annual salary of \$58,340, both above the US hourly wage of \$26.01 and yearly salary of \$54,115 for the correctional and jail officer group.
- As of September 30, 2022, the Nevada Department of Corrections was authorized for 1063 non-custody and 1874 custody personnel.
- On September 30, 2022, 768 non-security and 1295 security positions were filled by NDOC. Both non-security and security personnel positions are below permitted levels. There has been difficulty hiring and retaining all personnel due to retirements, departures of both recruits and staff for other positions, and other personal reasons.

- > From 2019 to 2020 the size of the U.S. and Nevada populations increased by 0.37% and 0.79%, respectively.
- > The largest increase in crime in Nevada was in arson, with the rate rising 47.87%, while for the U.S., the greatest increase was in homicide rising by 27.45%.
- > The most outstanding decline in Nevada was the decreased in the burglary crime rate of 27.07% and in the U.S. the greatest decline was observed in rape, which declined by 10.91%.
- > Nevada shares common characteristics with all of the U.S. in that property is the major crime category and homicide the lowest.
- > Crime rates in Nevada were as low as 5.7 per 100,000 inhabitants for homicide and as large as 1,926.6 per 100,000 inhabitants for property crime.
- > In all of the U.S. homicide was as low of 6.5 per 100,000 inhabitants and property crime as large as 1,958.2 per 100,000.
- > Violent crime and rape rates, however, are more pronounced in Nevada, while larceny-theft crime is more pronounced in the U.S. as a whole.
