

Average Daily Operating Cost per Offender (Legislatively Approved - FY 2025)¹



Populations, Custody, and Sentence Length







Footnotes

- Note: The figures in this report involve estimates from live data extracted from a data warehouse. Thus, select distributions may not add up to 100% due to rounding or may not equal to the totals in published reports. Report run dates for select statistical information may affect totals and cause them not to balance to the actual population at month end until fully reconciled.
- Unless otherwise stated, all data is derived from the NOTIS data warehouse, and includes all offenders which are not on parole.
- 1. Daily operation costs of incarceration are authorized with each fiscal year's budget approved by the Nevada Legislature each Legislative Session. Figures given are average daily costs per offender.↔
- Full-time-equivalent (FTE) positions are authorized with each fiscal year's budget approved by the Nevada Legislature each Legislative Session represent those supported by the General Fund; and NDOC's Inmate Store, Inmate Welfare, Prison Industries, and Dairy Farm. Active FTE position counts are reconciled weekly by NDOC's Human Resources Division. Current FTE counts are currently not available.
- 3. Total population counts reflect the number of sentenced individuals housed in institutions in Nevada or in other states, and serving time on residential confinement. In-house population only includes offenders housed in NDOC facilities. The counts are derived from NDOC's data warehouse.↔
- 4. This includes facilities which are either currently active or shuttered, but not those that are closed.
- 5. The distribution of parolees is derived from data from the NOTIS data warehouse. This only includes prisoners which are currently on parole. Parole information is from Nevada Division of Parole and Probation.
- 6. Offenders in the intake process, and some who are pending classification changes, are listed as unassigned. Approved custody levels are shown in this count. This figure only includes in-house offenders.↔
- 7. Sentencing information is derived from the NOTIS data warehouse and gives the length of an offender's overall maximum sentence. This figure reports the total NDOC population, including escapees and those in residential or out-of-state confinement.↔
- 8. The ages represent the mean and 50th percentiles for the total population as of the date of the fact sheet and for the cumulative number of individuals admitted and released during the past 52 weeks.
- 9. NDOC has been gradually converting its offender population racial and ethnic group categories pursuant to the U.S. Office of Management and Budget 1997 Standards for the Classification of Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity. These standards encompass a minimum of five racial groups and Hispanic or Latino as a dichotomous ethnic category.
