

MEDICAID

Nevada Medicaid provides health coverage at little to no cost for eligible residents. Eligibility is based on factors such as income, household size, age, disability status, and other circumstances. The program serves different groups, such as children, pregnant women, elderly adults, individuals with disabilities, and low-income adults.

The Medicaid Program is a federal program administered by the state. Its purpose is to help meet the cost of medical services for individuals receiving public assistance payments, and individuals and families with low income. The program objective is to provide medical and related services to assist individuals to attain or retain an optimal level of health care.

Eligibility Groups

Adults age 19-64 with income at or below 138% FPL qualify, including adults with or without dependent children.

Pregnant women with income up to 190% FPL qualify as of July 1, 2025. Coverage extends for 60 days postpartum.

Children ages 6 through 18 are eligible for Medicaid with household income at or below 138% FPL, with the option for Nevada Check Up (CHIP) coverage up to 205% FPL.

Nevada automatically provides Medicaid to SSI recipients who meet categorical requirements.

Special income and asset limits apply for the Aged, Blind, and Disabled (ABD) category, which covers seniors 65 and older, blind individuals, and disabled individuals.

SUBJECT: ANNUAL CHANGES TO THE CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (CCDP) HOUSEHOLD SIZE
AND MONTHLY INCOME LIMITS

Every year, the federal government publishes the income figure which establishes Nevada's median income. A percentage of this figure is used to determine a household's eligibility and subsidy level for child care benefits.

The Child Care and Development Program (CCDP) Household Size & Monthly Income Chart shown below contains updated two-tiered income eligibility limits. The income limits on this chart are effective October 1, 2025.

The Nevada Child Care System (NCCS) has been updated to ensure the correct subsidy level is applied to all new applications and ongoing certificates. Subsidy eligibility remains at or below 41% of the State Median Income (SMI) for initial intake applications, and at or below 49% of SMI for renewal applications.

The CCDP Policy Manual will be updated to reflect this change with the next manual release.

Keys to a Successful Parole Plan

Parole Process

- You will see parole board 3 months prior to your PED.
- Your caseworker will request information from you to draft a parole report 2 months prior to your scheduled board date.

Once you have seen the Parole Board and 'Granted' parole, we will then start investigating your initial parole plan (the plan you submitted to your caseworker for your parole report).
 Once an approved parole plan is established parole documents will be sent to your institution w/parole release instructions.

NO QUESTION IS A DUMB QUESTION!

THE KEY TO A SUCCESSFUL PAROLE IS YOU - ONLY YOU CAN PLAN YOUR OWN DESTINY

PED = Parole Eligibility Date - this is your potential date not your release date

- Prior to you going in front of parole board, a parole report will need to be completed.
- Complete form 2087 contained within your packet of information.
- **The 2087 form is very important to your parole report.**
- Make sure to provide a **Primary and Secondary Parole Plan on your 2087**. This will help your chances to parole out in a timely manner. If you have a third plan, please write it on the back of the form.
- The 2087 form is your Parole Plan for release - you may select a residential plan, an interstate compact or a halfway house or a hotel/motel from the approved placement list.
- **The list of the approved halfway houses and hotels/motels is included in this packet.**
- Make sure you review the requirements - what does you must have on your I-File, the type of inmate that the halfway house or hotel/motel allow, and the cost of the deposit to secure your spot.
- Indigent Funding may be requested for a halfway house that is on the approved list. See approved list for the halfway houses that accept indigent funds. Indigent funds **do not** cover Motels/Hotels.
- If you are requesting indigent funds, make sure you note it on your form 2087.
- If you have used indigent funds, absconded, have a **felony hold**, or escaped/attempted escape in the past, you **WILL NOT** qualify for the indigent inmate funds.
- You can self-fund (pay for yourself) to one of the approved halfway houses or hotel/motels. Once accepted, your family can make payment, or you can send a brass slip. You will need to work with your NDOC Caseworker for the brass slip process. Do not self-pay in advance. You must be accepted prior to making payment, refunds may not be available.
- If you are a Veteran and have your docs in your I-File you may apply to the VA Community Resource and Referral Center (CRRC).

HOW TO COMPLETE YOUR 2087 (PAROLE PLAN)

- **Halfway House Plan**
 - Send a kite to P&P here at High Desert State Prison and we will kite the application to you.
 - Make sure you review the qualifications and requirements of the Halfway House.
 - This will help you to select the correct halfway house and reduce denials.
 - **Do not pay the deposit until the P&P staff can confirm you have been accepted.**
 - Not all the halfway houses issue refunds.
 - By selecting the correct halfway house when you go to the Parole Board this will save you time and you will parole in a timely manner.
- **Hotel/Motel Plan**
 - Select a hotel/motel from the approved list- this will increase your chance of being approved.
 - Review the qualifications and requirements.
 - Submit for consideration.
 - Do not pay the deposit until the P&P staff can confirm- hotels/motels do not issue refunds.
 - By selecting the correct hotel/motel from the approved list this will help you parole in a timely manner.
 - Indigent funding is NOT used for Hotels/Motels.
- **WHAT NOT TO PUT ON YOUR PAROLE PLAN**
 - Homeless Shelters - cannot be your PRIMARY Plan - will only be considered when all other options have been exhausted.
 - Casa Grande- no longer accepts parolees.
 - Sober Living placements of any kind.
 - Family or friends that are recent ex-felons.
 - Family or friends that have weapons in the home and not willing to secure these weapons.
 - Family or friends that have vicious/aggressive animals.
 - Family or friends that have alcohol or illegal drugs in the home and not willing to get rid of these items.
 - Hotels or weekly's that are not on the approved list- if you put a non-approved hotel/motel on the list it has a higher chance of denial - Parole and Probation require a minimum of two weeks secured - this will be treated as a residential plan and a sponsor is needed to meet with the Parole Officer. Hotel/motel staff are not sponsors - if this is provided it will be denied.
 - Victims of your offense or co-defendants - placement will be denied.

SECTION 8 HOUSING INFORMATION

The Section 8 program in Nevada continues to assist low-income families, seniors and individuals with disabilities in securing affordable housing.

Here are the key requirements for the Section 8 program in Nevada for 2025:

- **Income Limits:** Applicants must have a household income at or below 50% of the area median income (AMI). For high-demand areas like Las Vegas, the limits are adjusted to reflect higher living costs. Priority is often given to households earning 30% or less of AMI.
- The income thresholds in 2025 reflect Nevada's higher cost of living, especially in urban centers like Las Vegas and Reno. Eligible households must provide proof of income and may qualify for deductions (e.g., childcare or medical expenses) to lower their adjusted gross income.
- The following table shows the current income limits in Nevada.

- **Citizenship or Immigration Status:** At least one member of the household must be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen.
- **Background Checks:** Applicants with certain criminal histories, such as violent offenses, may be disqualified.
- **Rental History:** A clean rental history, free from recent evictions or lease violations, is required.
- **Priority Groups:** Preference may be given to elderly individuals, families with children, veterans, and those experiencing homelessness.

How Do I Apply for Section 8 Housing in Nevada?

The application process in 2025 has been streamlined, with housing authorities offering online portals for improved accessibility:

1. **Determine Eligibility:** Verify income, residency, and other qualifying factors.
2. **Find a Housing Authority:** Nevada's program is managed locally. Major housing authorities include:

3. **Submit Application:** Provide required documentation, such as income proof, identification, and residency status.
4. **Await Placement:** Due to high demand, waiting lists can extend for several months to years, depending on the region.

The application process may vary slightly depending on the housing authority in your area. Some housing authorities may require additional documentation or have different application procedures. Contact your local housing authority for specific instructions on how to apply for Section 8 housing in your area.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

The quickest and easiest way to apply for SNAP is online through Access Nevada at <https://dss.nv.gov/SNAP>

Before you begin the application process, please read information on the next page.

If your household has little or no money and needs help right away; inform the Social Services Office and you may be eligible to receive SNAP benefits within 7 business days.

After you have submitted your application you will be scheduled an interview. At your interview your case worker will explain the program rules and assist you in completing your application if necessary. During the interview process your case worker will also ask you for proof of certain information. It's important that you understand the rules, so don't hesitate to ask your case worker to explain anything you don't understand.

After you have completed the interview, the Social Services Office will notify you by mail of your qualification status, and if approved the monthly amount of SNAP benefits you will receive and the how many months of benefits you are qualified for before you need to reapply.

If you are qualified for SNAP benefits, you will receive your Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card with your monthly approved benefit amount no later than 30 business days from the date the office received your application.

If you and everyone you live with are applying for or getting Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits, you may apply for SNAP benefits at your Social Security district office, except in California (where people who receive SSI get cash instead of SNAP benefits).

- Households applying for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or Medicaid can apply for SNAP benefits at the same time.
- Application is made at the local Social Services Office.
- After you have submitted your application, the Social Services Office will contact you to set up an interview to go over your application.

IF YOU CANNOT BRING THIS INFORMATION WITH YOU TO THE INTERVIEW, YOUR CASE MANAGER will give you time to gather it and bring it in. However, the sooner the information is provided, the sooner a determination can be made. If you cannot get the information, your worker will help you if you are cooperating to complete the application process.

WHAT HAPPENS AT THE INTERVIEW?

Your worker will question you about the facts you give on your application. Your case manager will give you a copy of your Rights and Obligations. READ IT CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING. If you have any questions or do not understand something, ask the case manager to explain it to you.

NOW, WHAT HAPPENS TO MY APPLICATION?

Your application will be processed. As soon as all the needed information is in the casefile, a decision will be made. You will get a letter in the mail telling you if you will receive assistance, how much, and for how long. If you are denied assistance, the letter will tell you why.

IF YOU ARE APPROVED, TAKE THE FOLLOWING PRECAUTIONS TO BE SURE YOUR EBT AND/OR MEDICAL CARD ARE DELIVERED TO YOU.

1. Be sure the District Office has your correct mailing address.
2. Make sure your name is on the mailbox.
3. We suggest you have a lock for your mailbox.

EBT CARDS ABSOLUTELY MUST NOT BE SOLD, GIVEN AWAY OR EXCHANGED FOR ANY ITEM. ONLY ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS MAY USE MEDICAL CARDS.

Temporary Aid to Needy Families (TANF)

Purpose

The purpose of the TANF program is to provide temporary assistance for the care of dependent children in their own homes or the homes of relatives by furnishing financial assistance, and self-sufficiency services.

Types of TANF Benefits

The Division of Social Services (DSS) administers five different TANF benefit programs. Two programs are considered assistance by federal definition and three are considered non-assistance programs. Nevada recognizes family situations vary and the approach for some to meet their immediate and ongoing needs should be different. When a family may qualify for more than one category, the family has the final decision on which category they wish to receive.

TANF-NEON

This is the state's cash assistance program for families with a 'work-eligible adults' in the home. Most parents and needy relative caregivers are defined as 'work-eligible' by federal regulation and are required to meet work participation requirements as a condition of eligibility. For this reason it is commonly referred to as our 'work program'. The work-eligible-adults must enter into a Personal Responsibility Plan for reducing or ending their household's dependency on public assistance. Adult(s), unless they meet an exemption, will be required to engage in a defined number of hours of work activities every week to maintain eligibility for cash benefits. TANF-NEON benefits are considered assistance and are subject to time limits.

TANF CHILD-ONLY

This is a cash assistance program for households with no 'work-eligible adults'. Generally the monthly cash benefits are paid because the child(ren) is living with a relative, referred to as a relative caregiver, because the parent(s) is not in the home or if they are in the home they are ineligible due to citizenship requirements or receiving SSI. An example of a Child-Only case would be an Aunt applying for assistance on behalf of her niece who is in her care and supervision. While Child-Only benefits are considered a form of assistance, they are not subject to time limits.

SELF-SUFFICIENCY GRANT (SSG)

This is a one-time lump sum payment to help families who would otherwise be eligible for another program to meet an immediate financial need. The intent is to preserve the family's independence from long-time dependence on Social Services. Recipients of a Self-Sufficiency Grant (SSG) are not eligible to receive TANF benefits for a period of time determined by dividing the SSG benefit amount provided by the maximum TANF benefit for the family size. Any part of a month counts as a full month. Households may receive TANF assistance prior to the end of the ineligible period if a qualifying hardship exists. Although the receipt of SSG

benefits are not considered assistance, they can preclude a household from receiving TANF/NEON benefits. Time-limits do not apply to SSG.

TEMPORARY (TEMP) PROGRAM

This program provides monthly cash payments to meet an immediate episode of need and is limited to no more than four months per episode. An episode of need is defined as an unforeseen circumstance such as fire, earthquake, etc. Benefits from the TEMP program are not defined as assistance. Time-limits do not apply.

TANF LOAN

This program provides eligible households with a monthly cash payment to meet the family's immediate basic needs when an adult member has a future anticipated source of income and the expectation is the benefits will be repaid upon receipt of the anticipated income. The expectation is that the benefits will be repaid upon receipt of the anticipated income. Benefits from the Loan program are not defined as 'assistance'. Time-limits do apply.

TANF Assistance Defined (TANF-NEON and CHILD-ONLY):

"Assistance" is defined as cash payments, provided to meet a family's ongoing basic needs such as food, shelter, clothing, etc. It may also include: child care, transportation and other support services.

Accepting *TANF-NEON* assistance subjects the household to federal and state time limits on receipt of assistance, including but not limited to: work participation requirements, cooperation with child support enforcement, activities included in federal data reporting, and cooperation with all other eligibility requirements.

Accepting *Child-Only* assistance subjects the household to cooperation with child support enforcement, activities included in federal data reporting, and cooperation with all eligibility requirements.

Eligibility Criteria

Age / School Requirements

- The head of household must ensure their children age 7 to 12 attend school as required by state law and take every reasonable action to ensure the child is not at risk of failing to advance to the next grade level.
- A child age 18 or over, not in school full-time, is ineligible.

- A child age 18 in school (high school, technical or vocational, includes GED program) full time and expected to graduate before or in the month of their 19th birthday is eligible for TANF through their graduation month.
- A child who will not graduate, or complete their GED, until after the month of their 19th birthday is ineligible the month following their 18th birthday.
- For minor parents to be eligible for assistance, they must be enrolled and attending high school or actively participating in a GED program and making adequate progress.

Agreement of Cooperation

Adult household member(s) must sign an Agreement of Cooperation which includes their responsibilities as a condition of receiving benefits and describes the penalties that may be imposed for failure to comply.

Assessment

(Applies to TANF/NEON, Loan and Child-Only):

An assessment is required for each household member to evaluate existing skills, prior work experience and employability. It also determines the family needs including job training, child care, substance abuse treatment, mental health services, domestic violence services, or other issues which may be barriers to self-sufficiency.
